CORRECT ELECTRICAL HOOK-UP

- 1. Locate power cord at the back of chair near the floor.
- 2. Safely route the cord under the cabinet, under the floor, or under a wire threshold to prevent a person from tripping.
- 3. Plug chair into 110 volt, 15 amp, ground-fault-interrupter (GFI) outlet. The GFI outlet is factory recommended and may be required by local codes.

CORRECT USE & OPERATION OF THE CHAIR

- 1. For safety, chair should be DOWN all the way for client entry & exit.
- 2. Demonstrate operation of the kick-out footrest that may be optionally used.
- 3. Using the control wand, raise chair so client is best-positioned for shampoo.
- 4. After shampoo, use the control wand to lower the chair AND insure that the footrest is closed to insure safe exit from the chair.
